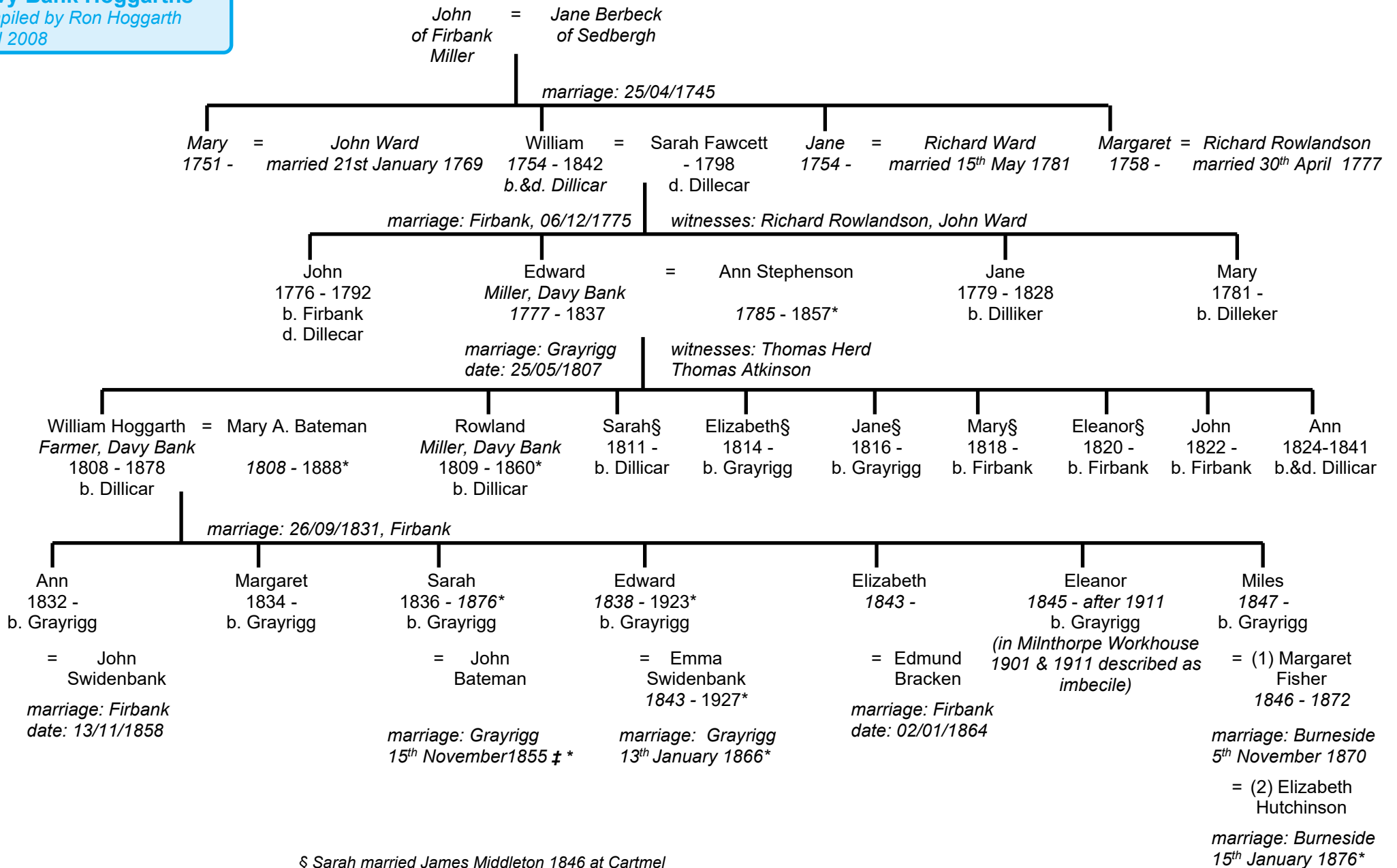

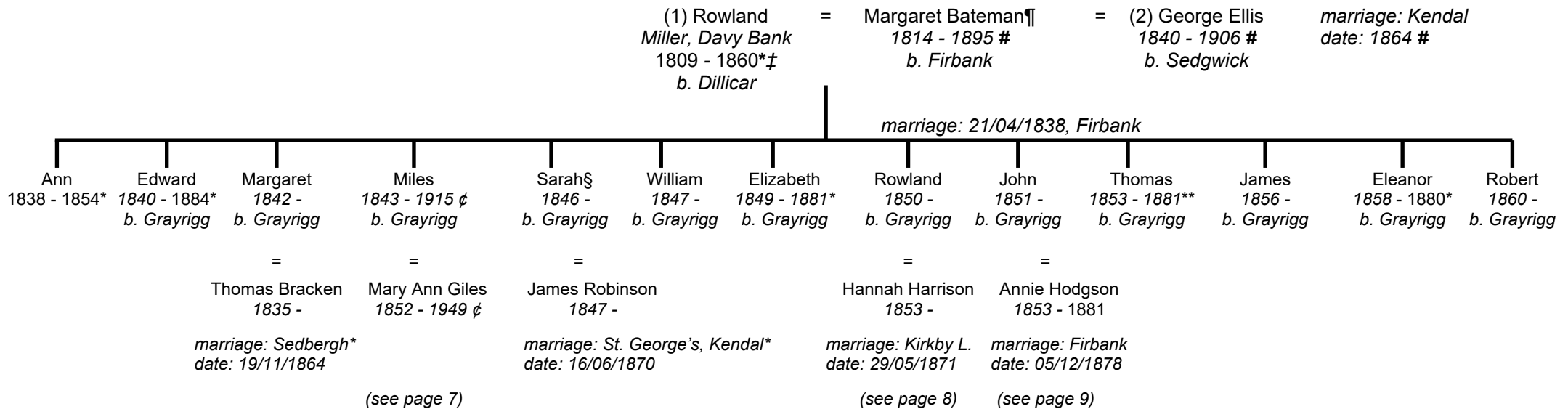

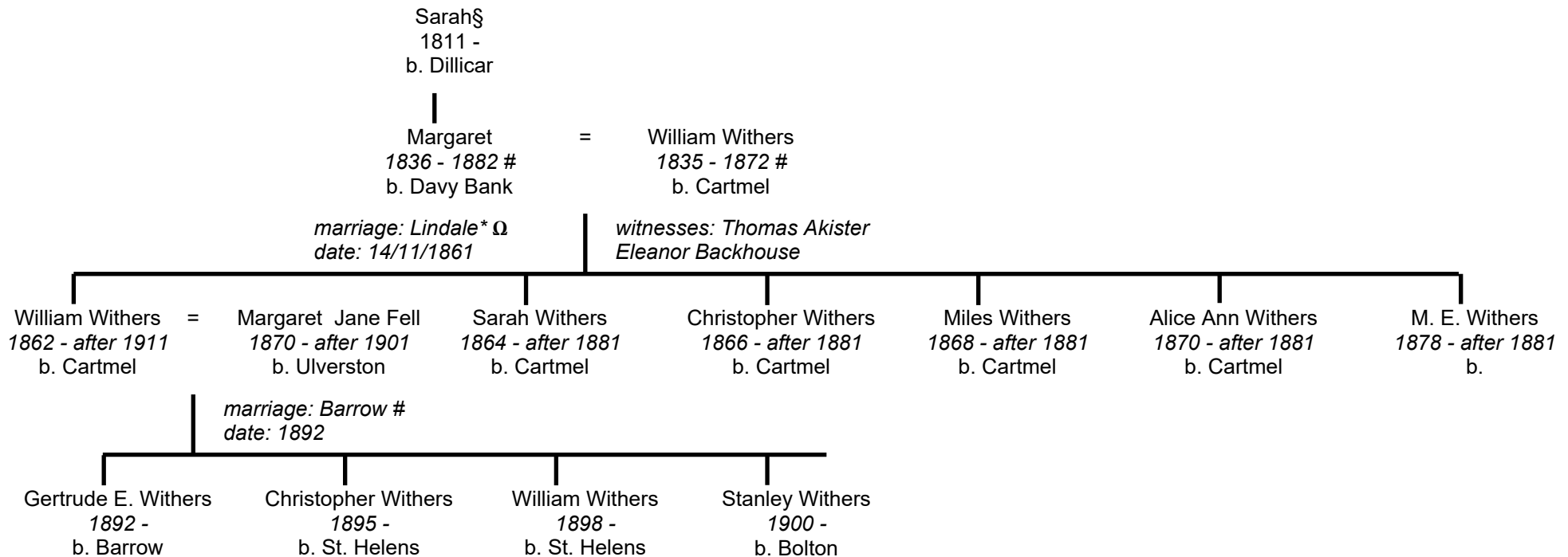

William and Margaret are living at Grange Fell in 1871. William is a plasterer's labourer. Margaret is widowed in 1881 and living with her family at Salthouse, Barrow-in-Furness. William Withers junior is a Police Constable in 1891 in Barrow. He is living in Bolton in 1901, a private in the Royal Garrison. He is a moulders labourer and in Bolton Workhouse in 1911. Margaret Jane Fell as an infant was in Ulverston Workhouse with her widowed mother and two siblings. In 1891 she was a housemaid at Conishead Priory.

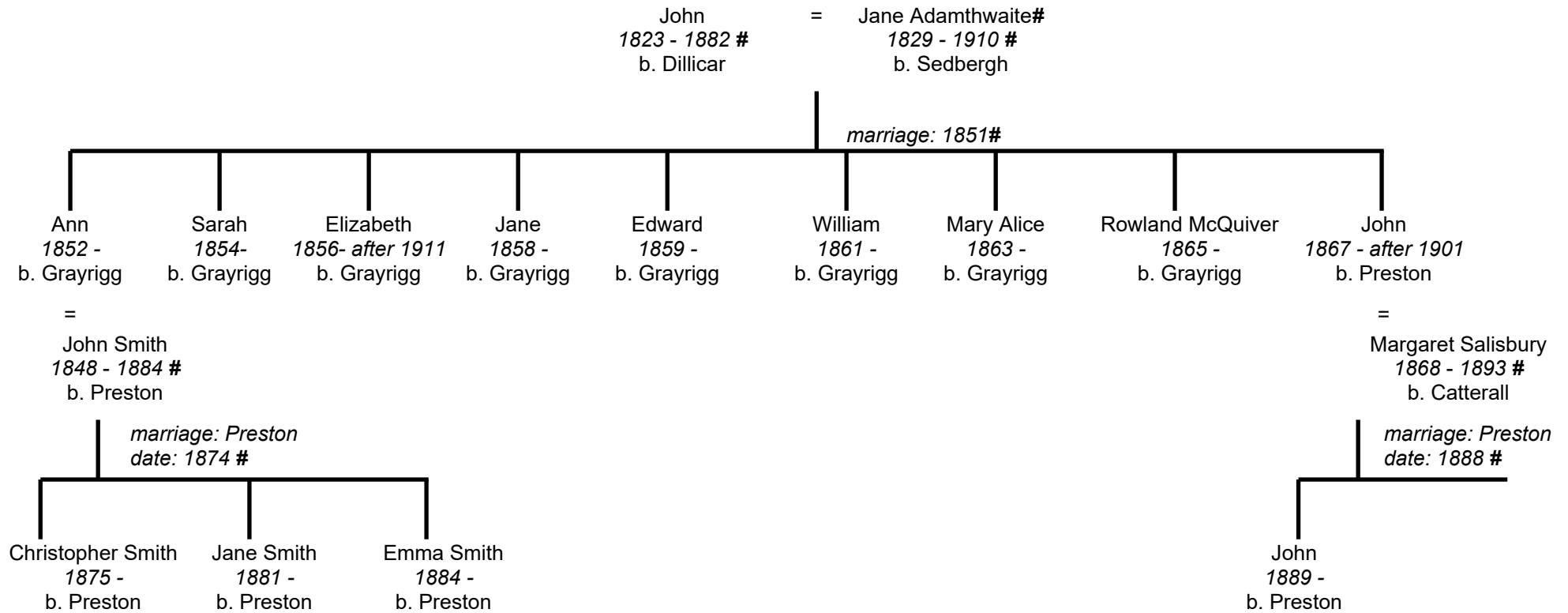

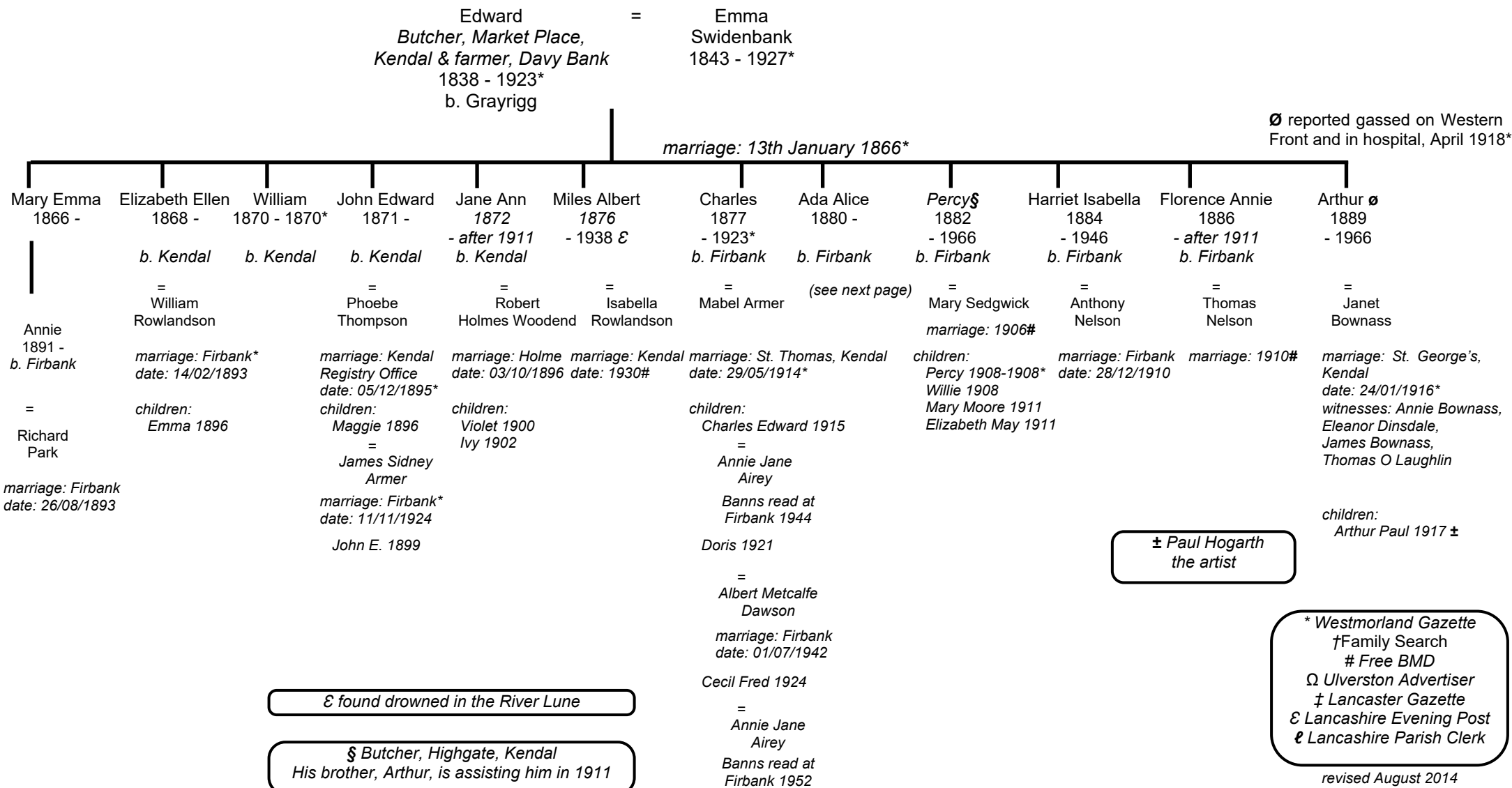
By 1881 John & Jane are in Preston working in the Cotton Mills

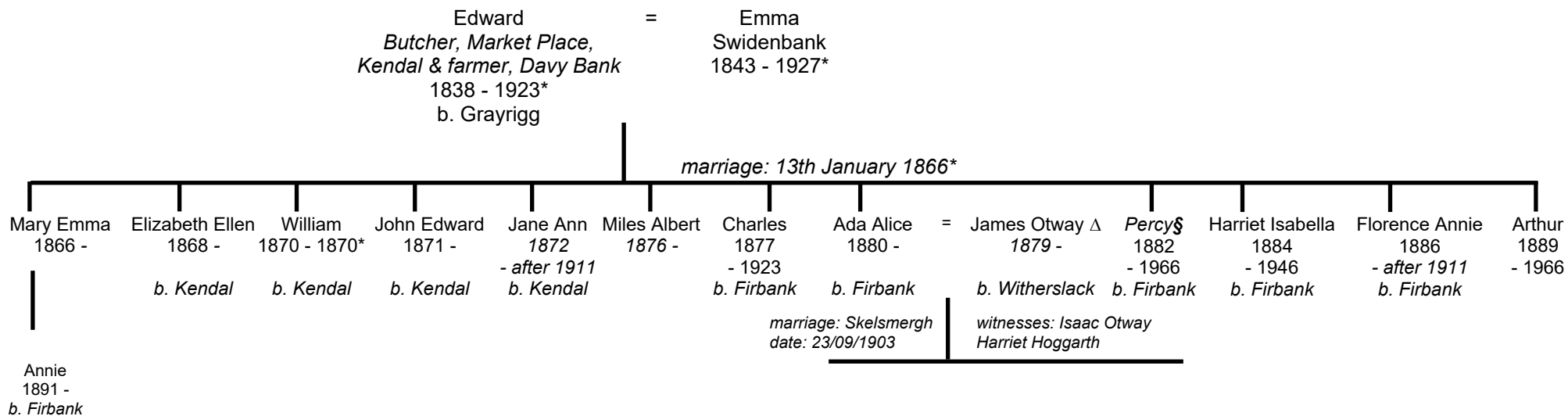

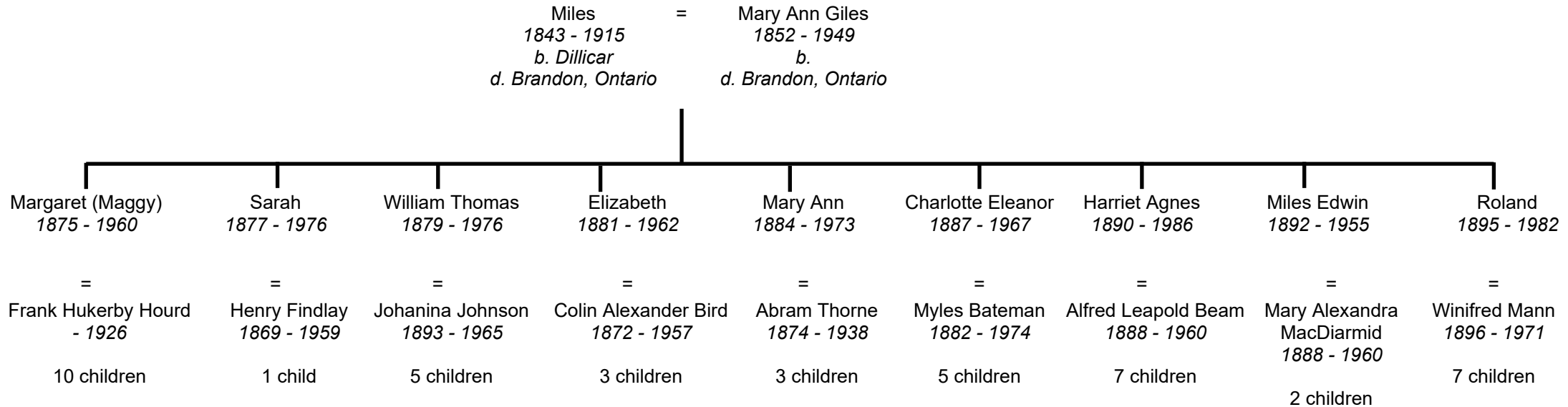

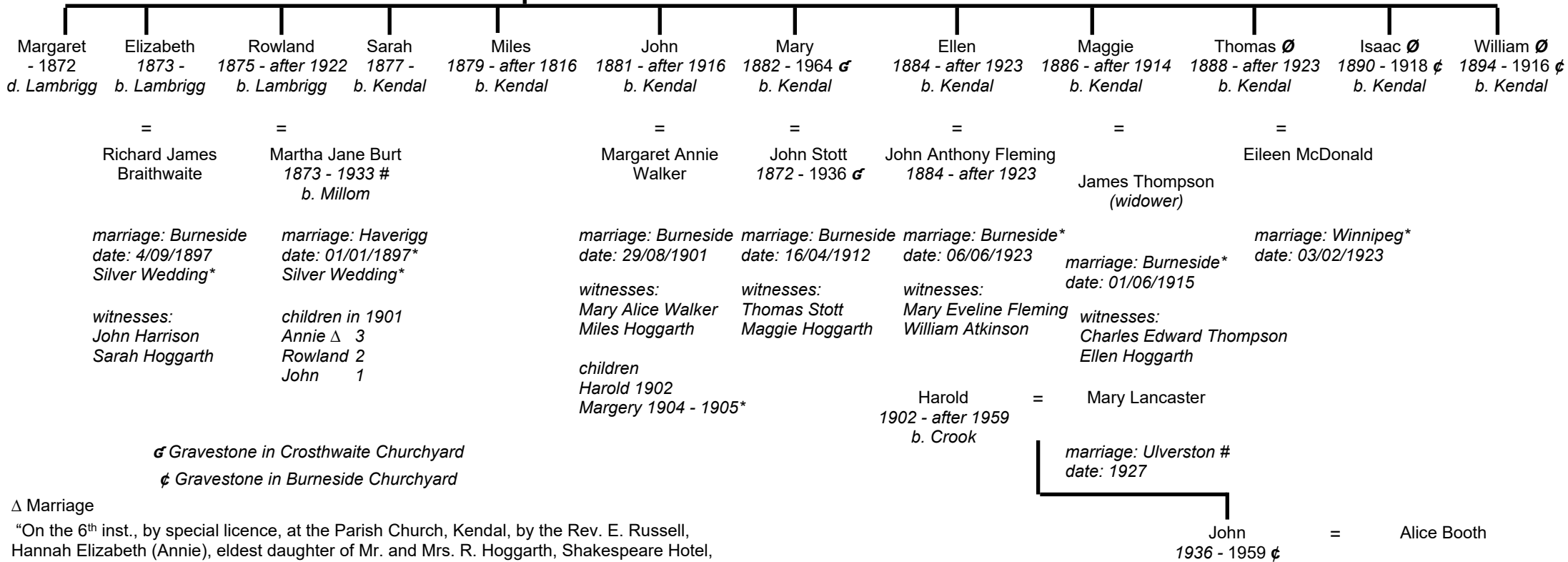

Provost Thomas Hoggarth, 83th (?) Batt., C.O.F., Calgary, Canada. Thomas emigrated to Canada aboard the Virginian from Liverpool in December 1912. Stated to be a Policeman but going to be a farmer, possibly to join his uncle Miles who emigrated to Manitoba

Sergeant William Hoggarth, 8th Batt., Border Regiment.

Sergeant John Hoggarth, Westmorland and Cumberland Yeomanry.

Private Isaac Hoggarth, Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders.

Myles Hoggarth, Liverpool, attested.

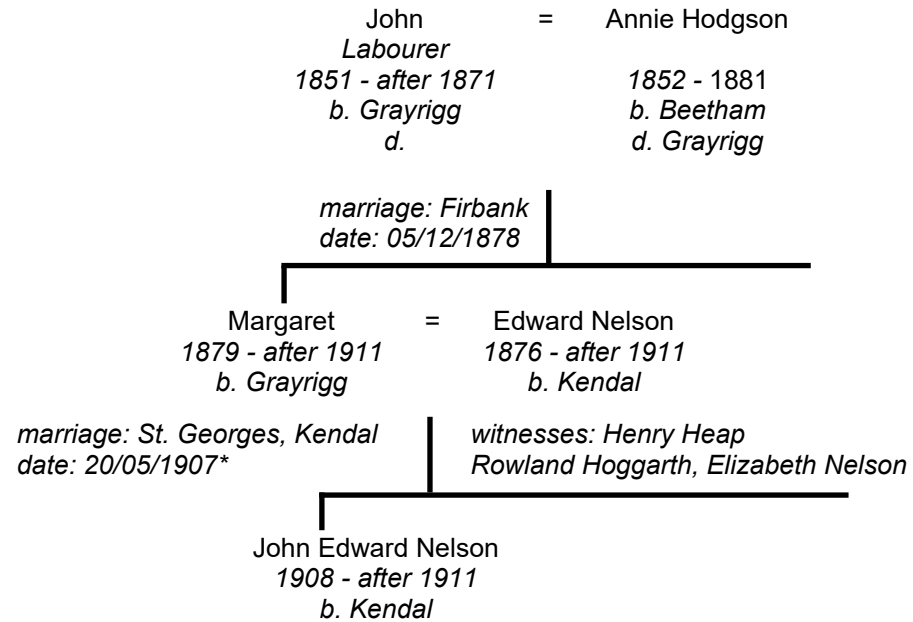
Rowland Hoggarth, Shakespeare Hotel, married, attested.

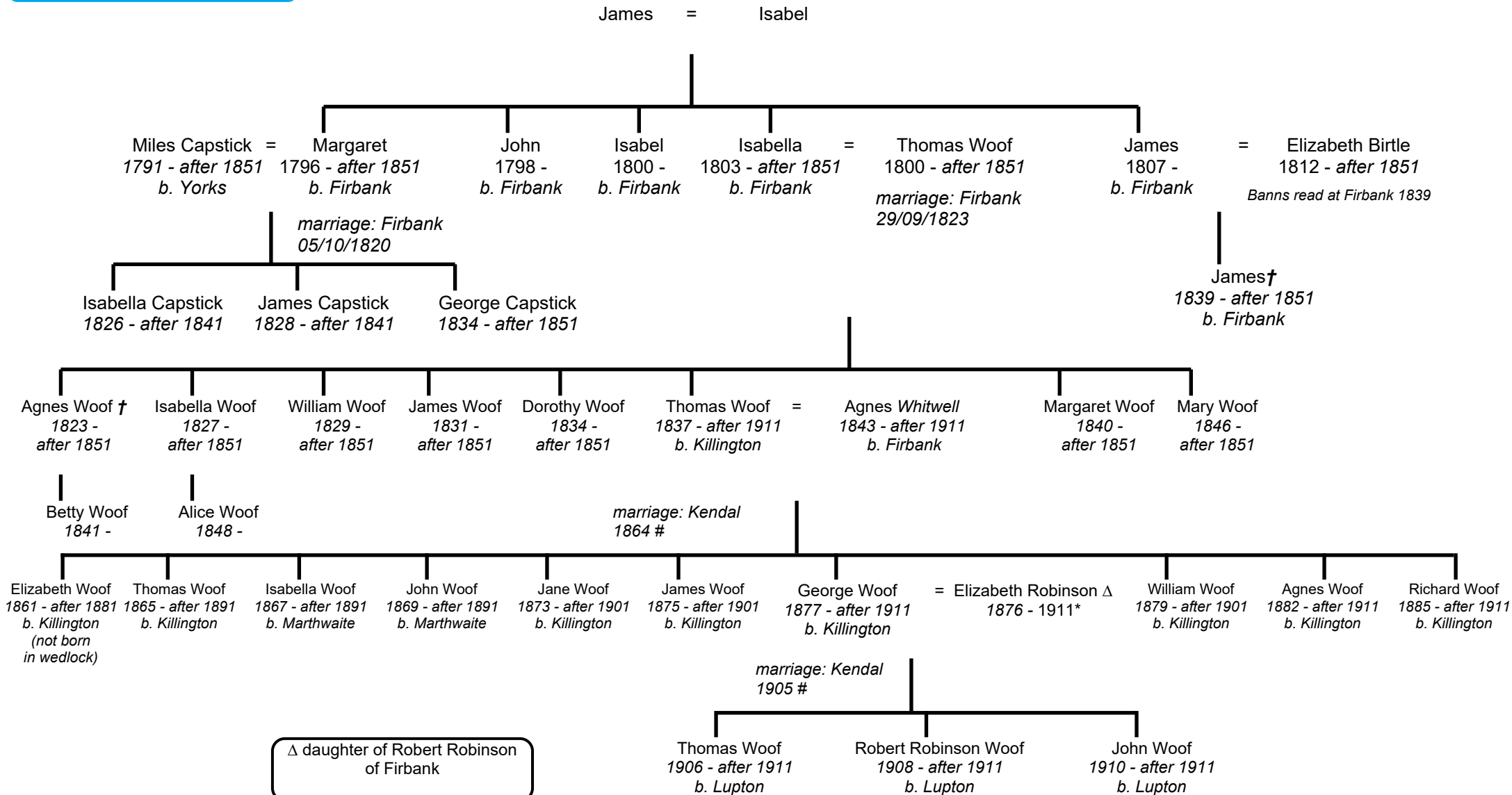
John Hoggarth of Yew Tree Farm Crook near Kendal Westmorland died 19 July 1959 at The County Hospital Kendal Administration Carlisle 12 October to Alice Hoggarth widow Harold Hoggarth retired licensed victualler and Leonard Aaron Booth farmer. Effects £7663 1s. 5d.

∅ **William** died of wounds, 6th July 1916.
∅ **Isaac** wounded 1916, died on the Western Front 1918, awarded the DCM
∅ **Thomas** wounded 1917 in Vimy Ridge fighting, also slightly wounded September 1st 1918.

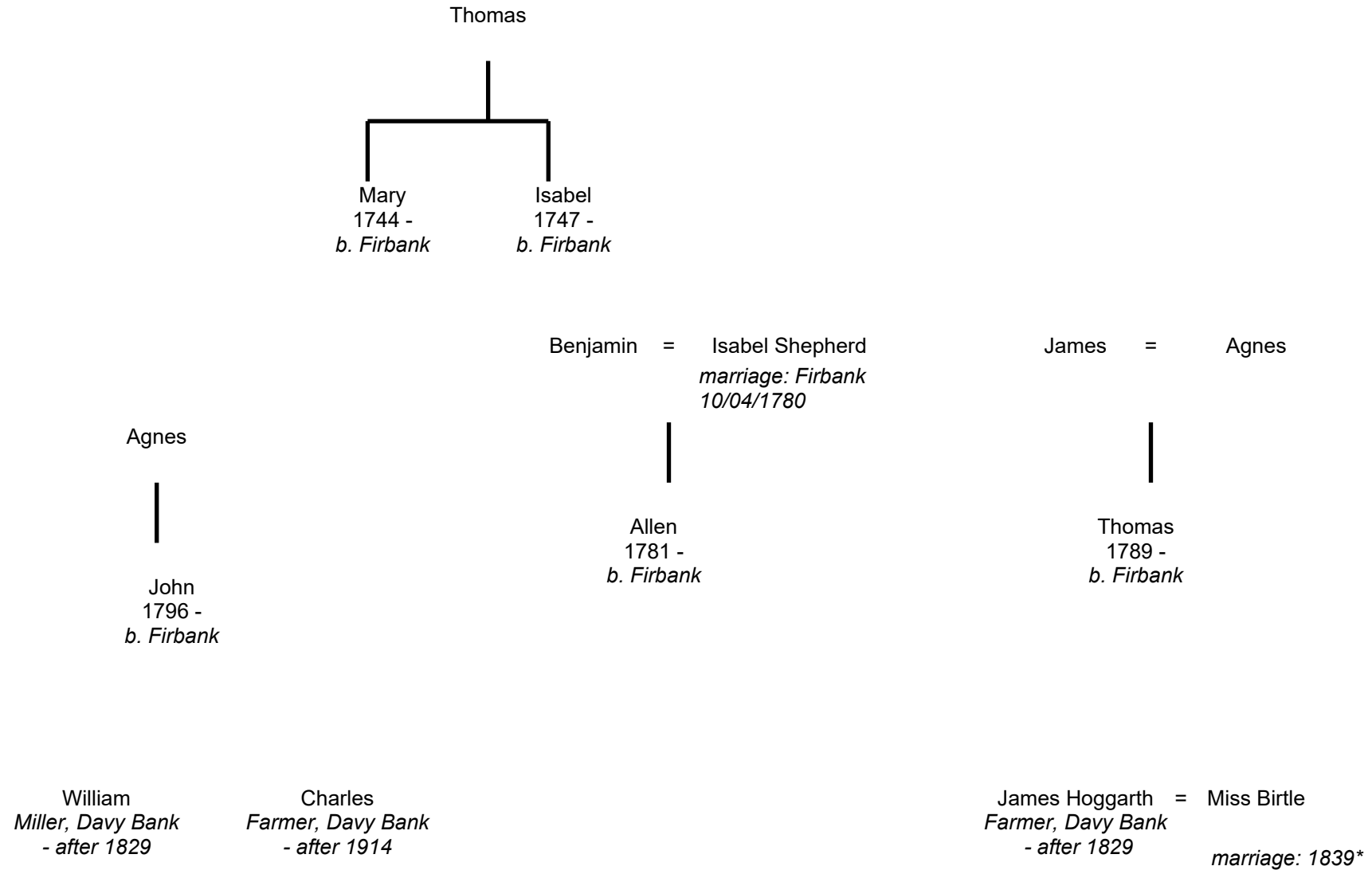
