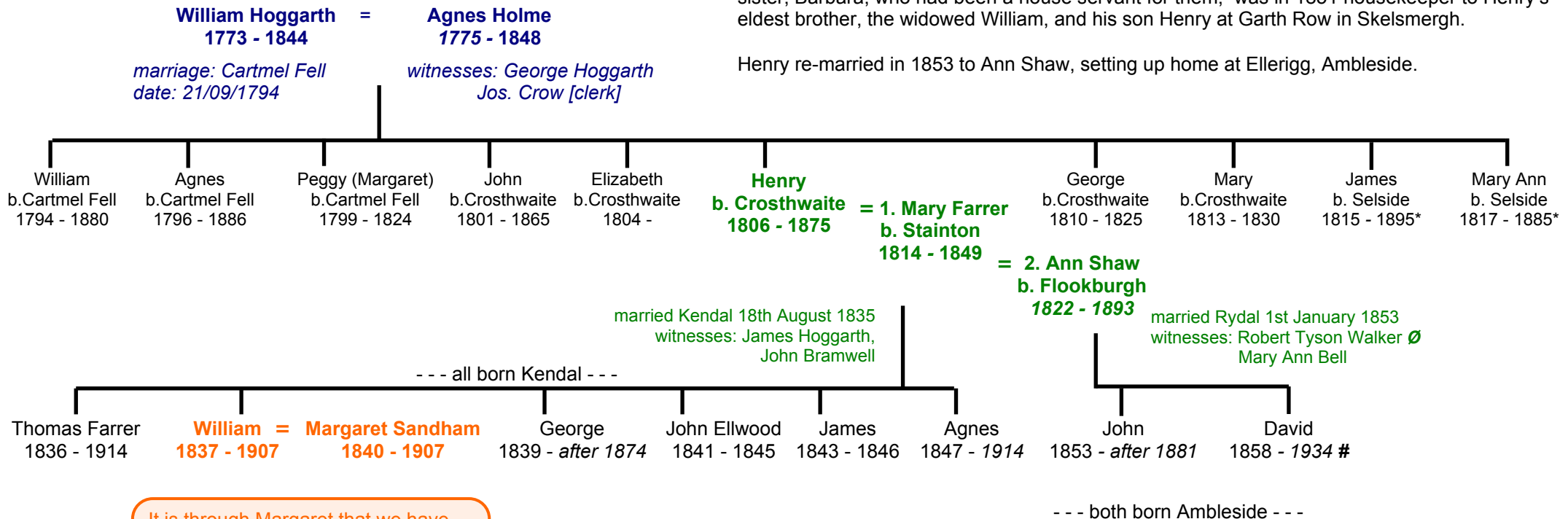
### The dispersal of a family

Towards the end of the 1840s Henry and Mary moved from Far Cross Bank in Kendal to Blue Hill near Ambleside, not far from his younger brother James, who had been a witness at their marriage, in Holy Trinity Church Kendal.

Sadly, Mary died of a fever in 1849. Shortly after in 1851, Henry and son George were living with James and his family at Coat Howe, Grasmere. Son Thomas Farrer was working at Crofts Farm, Levens, for his uncle, William Wilson, who had married Henry's younger sister, Mary Ann, in 1847. Son William is a farm servant for Robert Noble at Birds Park Farm, Kendal. This is near to Reservoir Cottage where his Aunt Isabella Martindale (née Farrer) was living. Henry's only daughter, Agnes, three years old, was being cared for by her Aunt Agnes, who had married John Ellwood in 1826. They were living at Hollins Farm, Strickland Roger.

Widower Thomas Farrer, who had been living in with the young family in Kendal in 1841, was living with daughter, Isabella, who had married Nathan Martindale in 1845. Mary's younger sister, Barbara, who had been a house servant for them, was in 1851 housekeeper to Henry's eldest brother, the widowed William, and his son Henry at Garth Row in Skelsmergh.

Henry re-married in 1853 to Ann Shaw, setting up home at Ellerigg, Ambleside.



It is through Margaret that we have the Family Bible or "Sandham's Book" which was the starting point for this family history research

Ø son of Richard & Agnes Walker, born in Ambleside, 1818. This could be the Richard Walker who married Agnes Tyson at Seathwaite in 1802 †, which raises the probability of Robert Tyson Walker being a descendant of Robert 'Wonderful' Walker.
