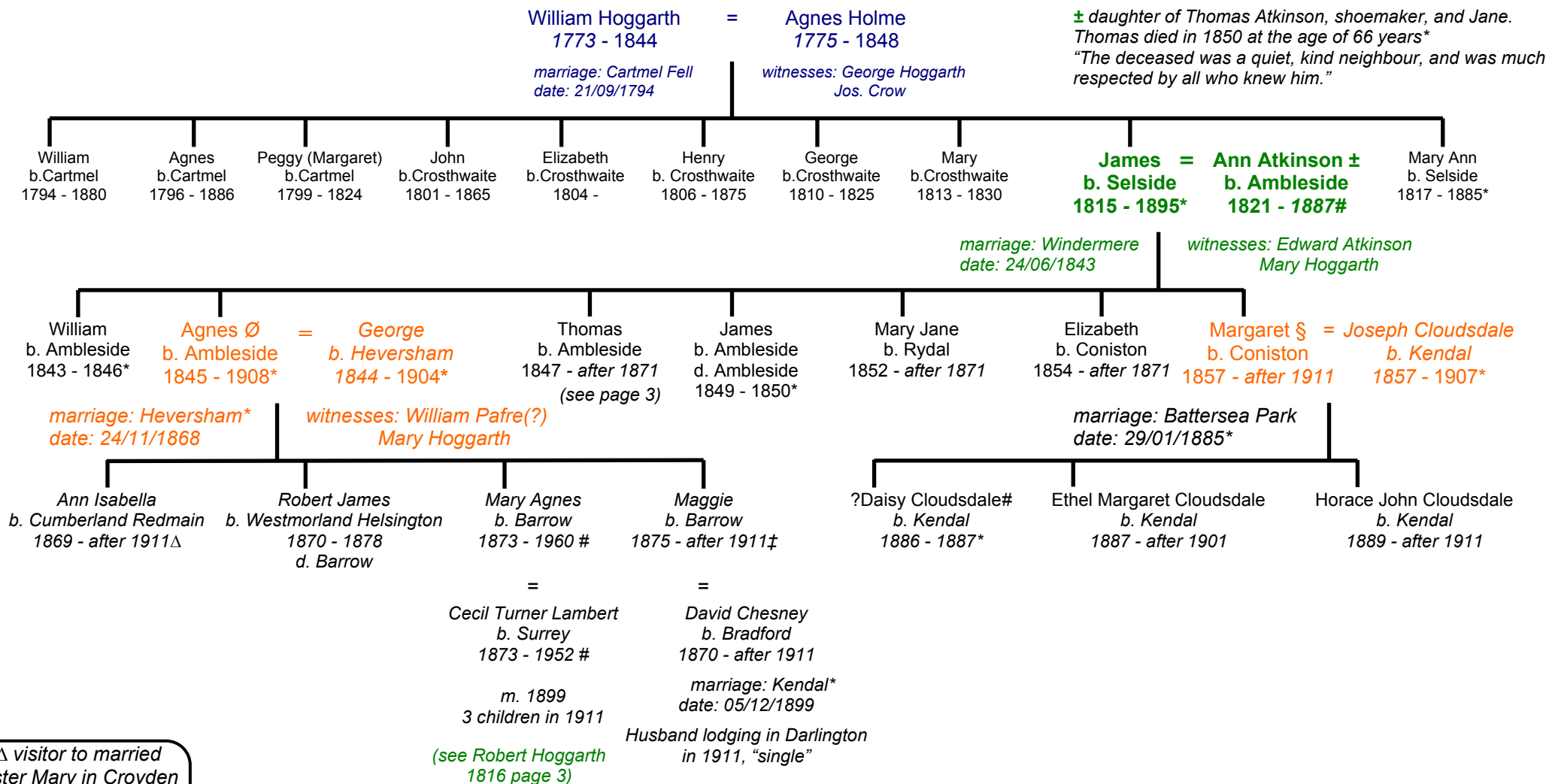

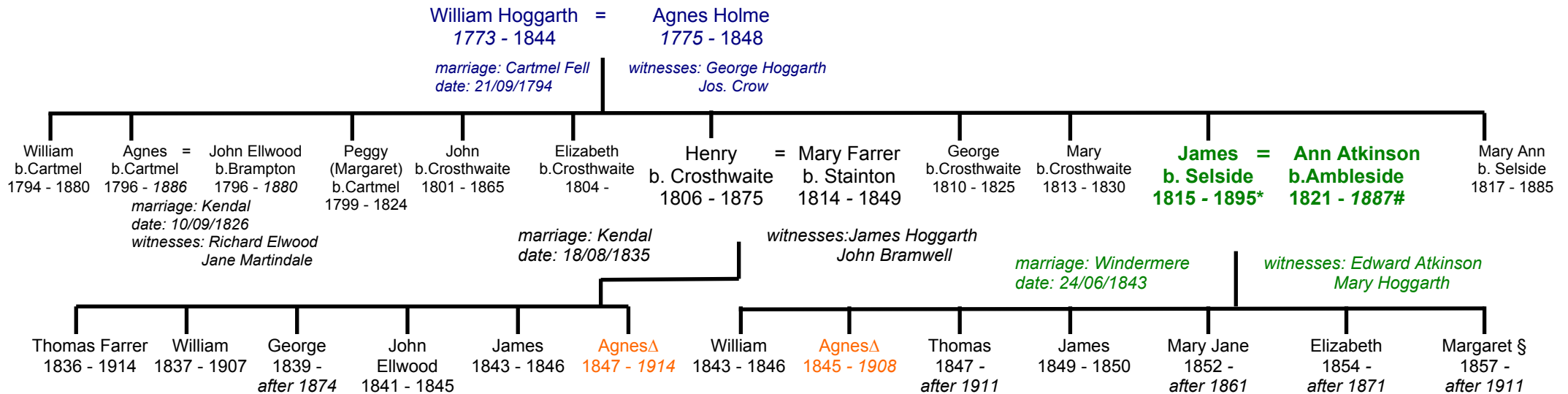

James Hoggarth was witness to Henry and Mary's marriage of 1835 at Holy Trinity Kendal. (At the time of the wedding, Mary's only brother, William Farrer, is 13 years of age.) In 1851 Henry, now a widower, and one of his sons, George, lodges with his brother James and family at Coat Howe, Rydal. Both brothers are described as farm labourers.

By 1861 James has become a gamekeeper and his family have moved into Hawkshead Parish. Henry has re-married and has set up home at Ellerigg near Ambleside. James' daughter, Agnes, and Henry's daughter, Agnes, (both named after their grandmother) are House Servants to Anthony and Margaret Barnes at Garnett House, Strickland Ketel near Kendal. Margaret Barnes is a married cousin, the daughter of John and Agnes Ellwood who live nearby at Hollins Farm.



Δ In 1861 both these Agneses are House Servants to the Barnes family in Strickland Ketel

§ married Joseph Cloudsdale in Wandsworth in 1885. Widowed James living with the family at Kendal in 1891

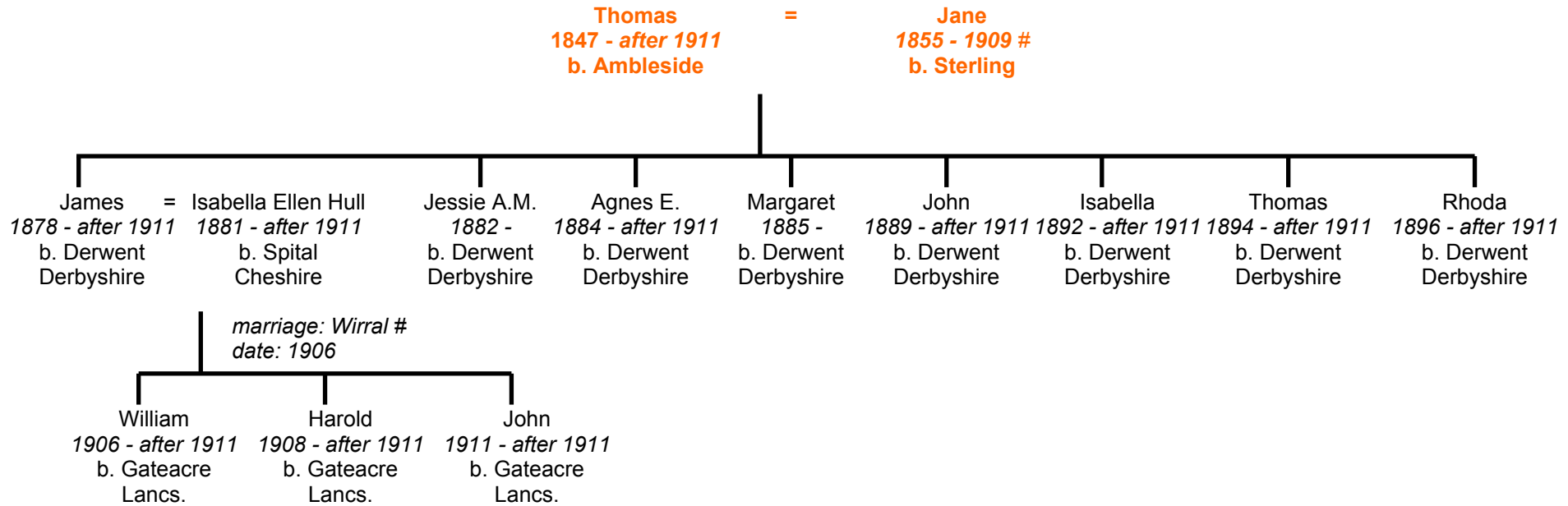

Thomas nephew of Henry born 1806

Like his father, Thomas was a gamekeeper. After his marriage, he and his family are living in Derbyshire, at Mill House, Derwent. Here all 8 children were born and alive in 1911. The family subsequently moved to Nottinghamshire. By 1911 widower Thomas was a nurseryman and jobbing gardener at Great Crosby. Agnes was a school teacher and John a nurseryman.
