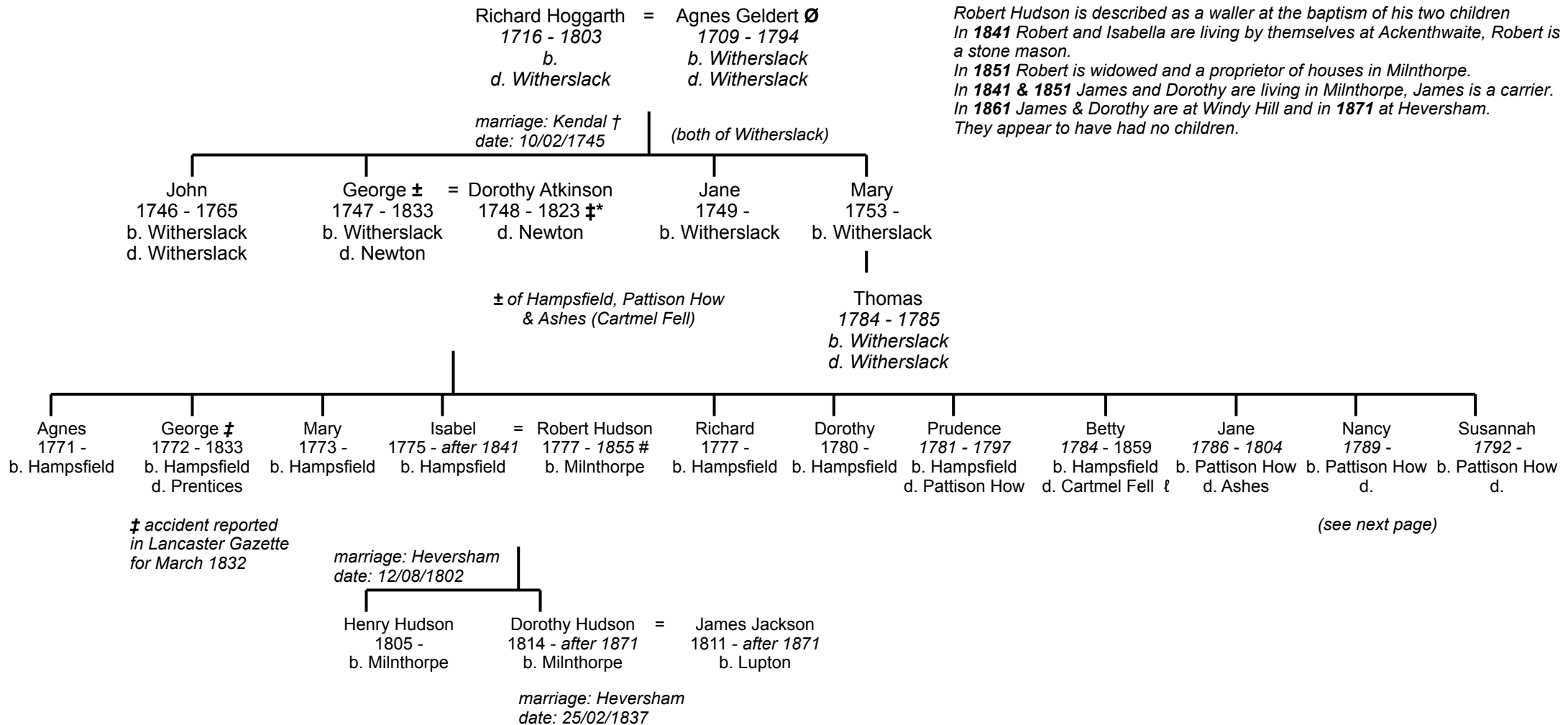


# Pattison How Hoggarths

Richard and Agnes's four known children were born at Kirket Nook, Witherslack. The John Hoggarth who was buried in 1765 is said to be the son of Richard Hoggarth of High Fell End. The illegitimate son of Mary Hoggarth was born and died days later at Gurnal Beck. When Agnes died in 1794, Richard is said to be a farmer of Townend Smithy in Witherslack.

Robert Hudson is described as a waller at the baptism of his two children In 1841 Robert and Isabella are living by themselves at Ackenthwaite, Robert is a stone mason. In 1851 Robert is widowed and a proprietor of houses in Milnthorpe. In 1841 & 1851 James and Dorothy are living in Milnthorpe, James is a carrier. In 1861 James & Dorothy are at Windy Hill and in 1871 at Heversham. They appear to have had no children.

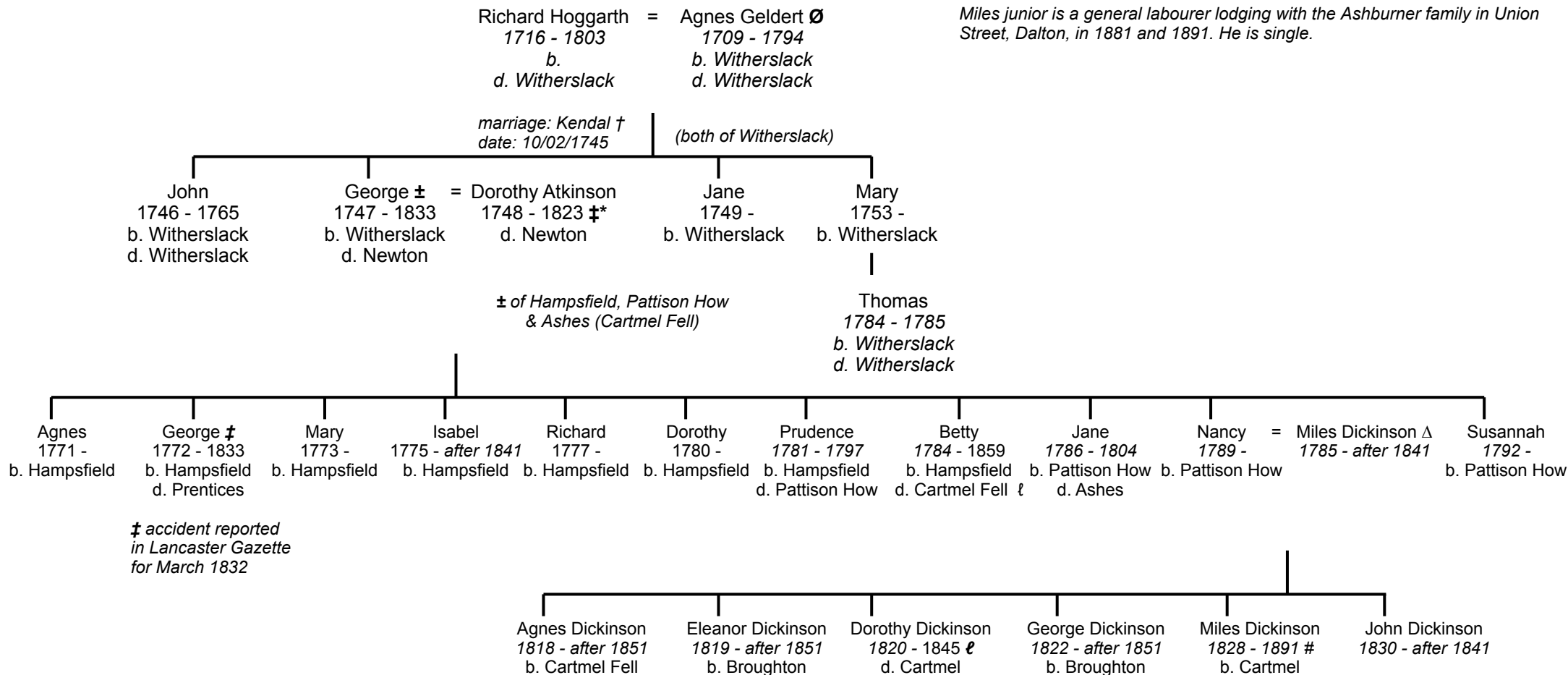
