For many years Robert farmed at Moss Side in Heversham. He then became an Innkeeper and farmer at The Derby Arms in Witherslack. He retired from farming in 1890 and was living with his daughter, Elizabeth, in Market Street, Milnthorpe in 1891.

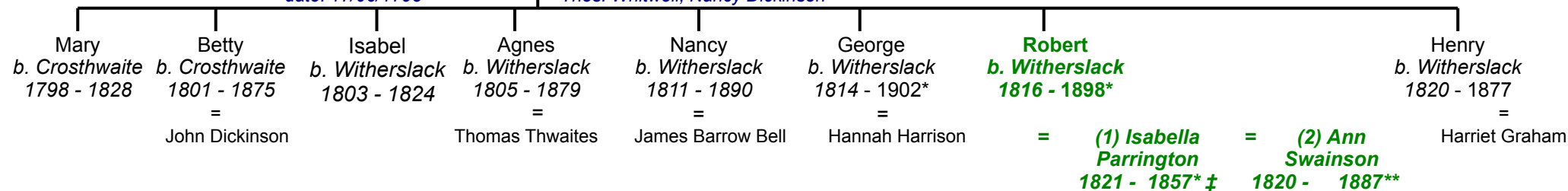
Robert died at the Commercial Hotel, Kendal in 1898, where his son George and daughter in law Agnes were the proprietors.

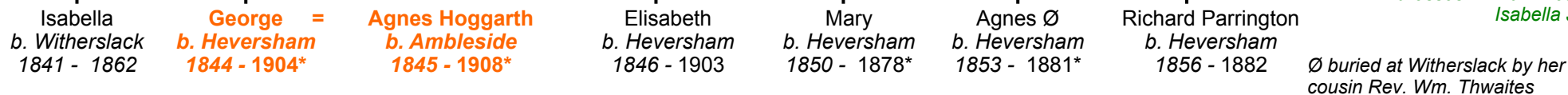

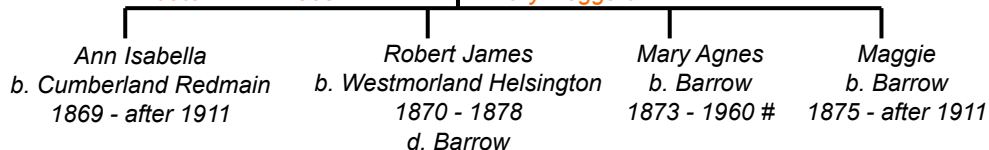

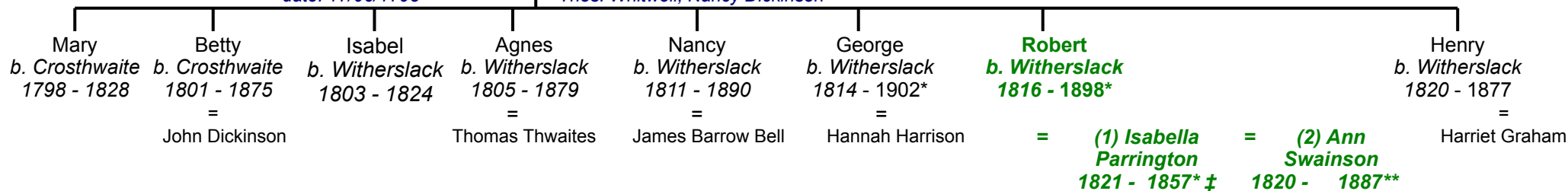
By 1861 James Hoggarth (born to William and Agnes in 1815 and Henry's brother) has become a gamekeeper and his family have moved from Ambleside into Hawkshead Parish. James' daughter, Agnes, and his brother Henry's daughter, Agnes, (both named after their grandmother) are House Servants to Anthony and Margaret Barnes at Garnett House in Burneside. Margaret Barnes is a married cousin, the daughter of John and Agnes Ellwood who live nearby at Hollin Hall.

It is James' Agnes that marries her second cousin George in 1868. George is the manager of a wine and spirits store in Dalton Road, Barrow in 1881. By 1897 he and Agnes have moved back to Kendal where George is an Innkeeper in Highgate. George dies at Kendal in 1904, Agnes in 1908. It is James' eldest brother William's daughter, Esther, who is the cousin visitor to the Derby Arms Inn on Census Day 1881

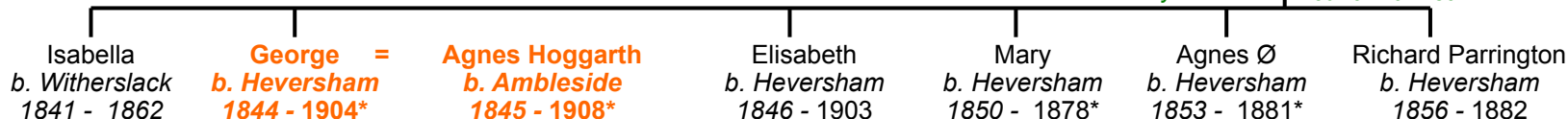

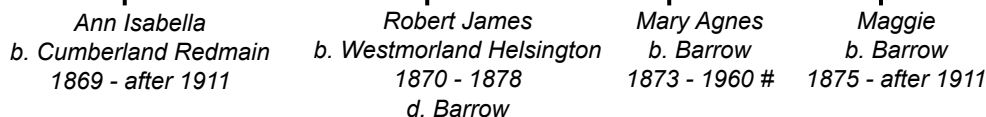

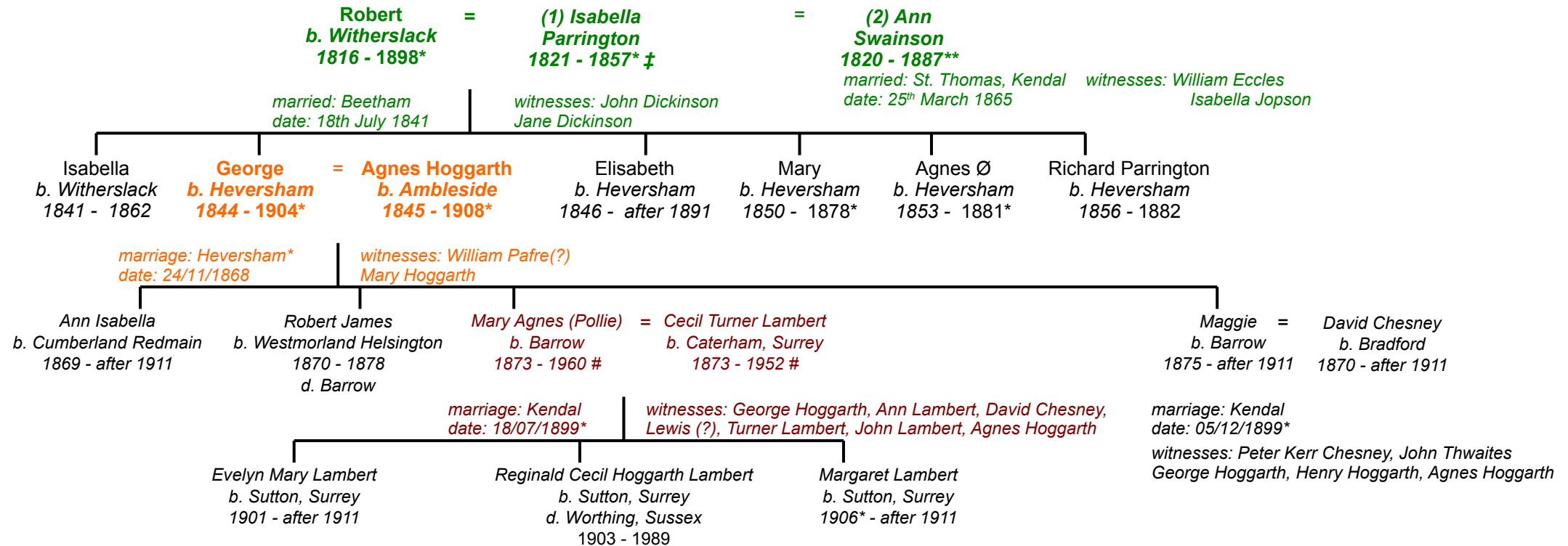
