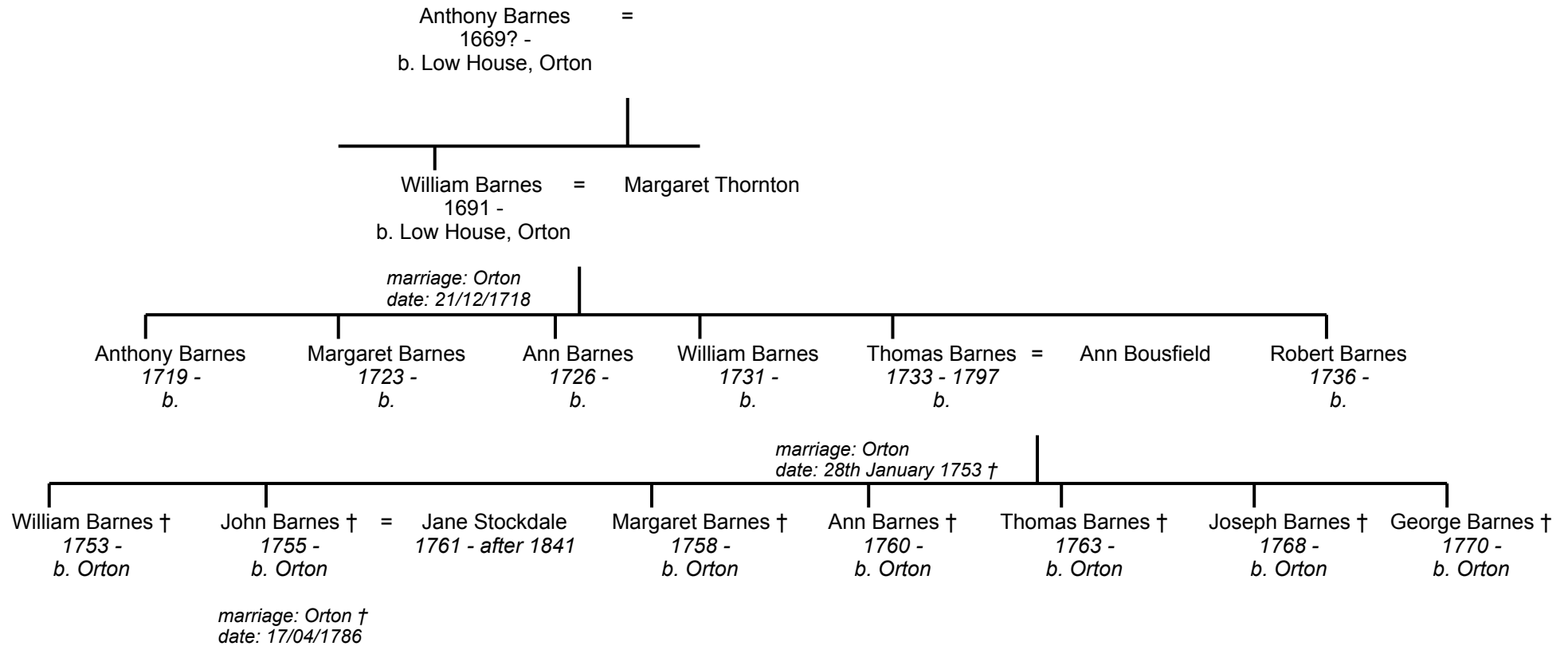

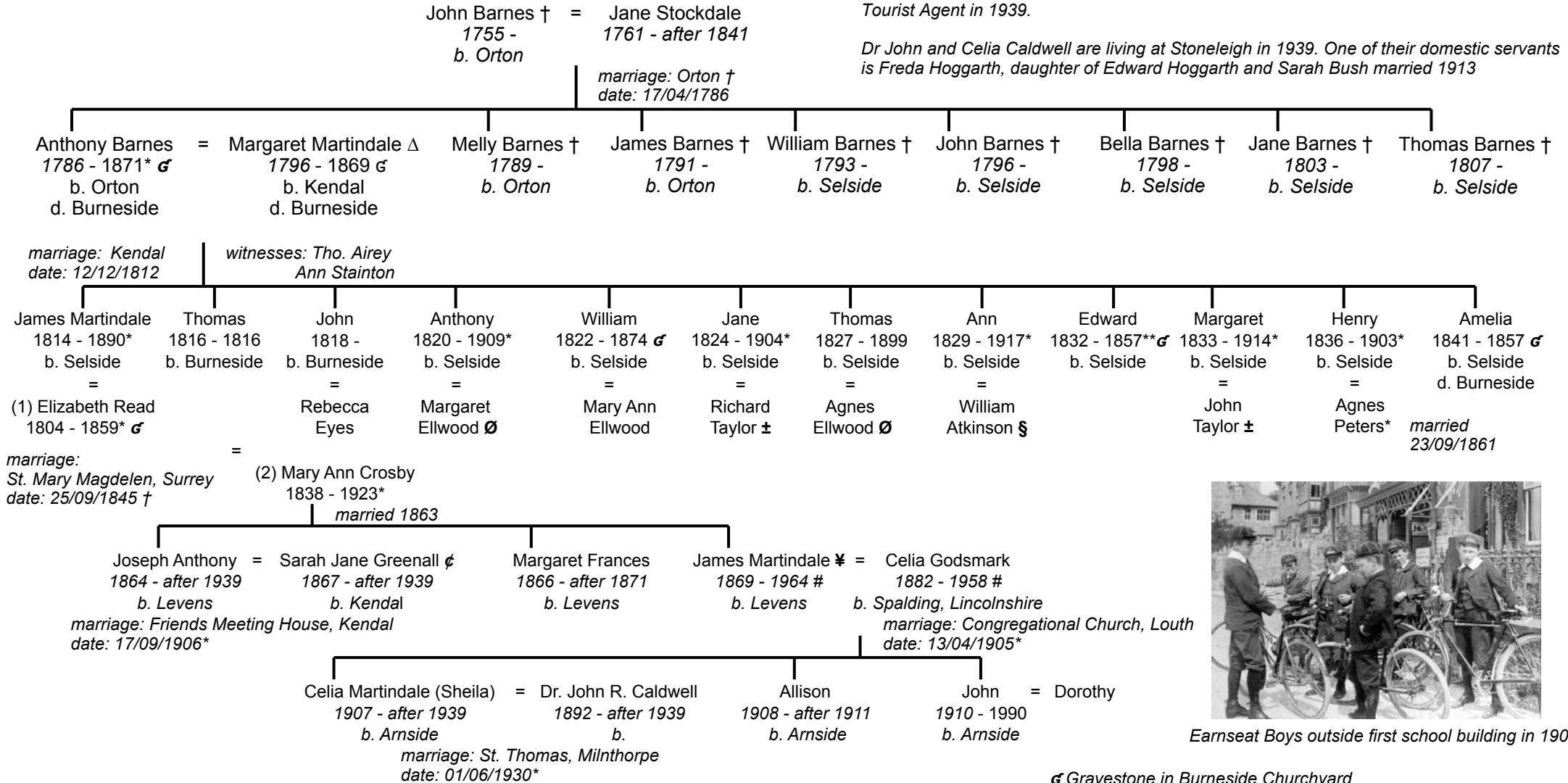

Joseph Anthony is a Wesleyan Minister boarding in Fenton, Stoke on Trent, in 1891. He is also listed as a Wesleyan Minister when living with his widowed mother at Levens in 1901. He is a Tourist Agent living at 5 Ashleigh, Kendal, in 1911, no children. He is a retired Tourist Agent in 1939.
