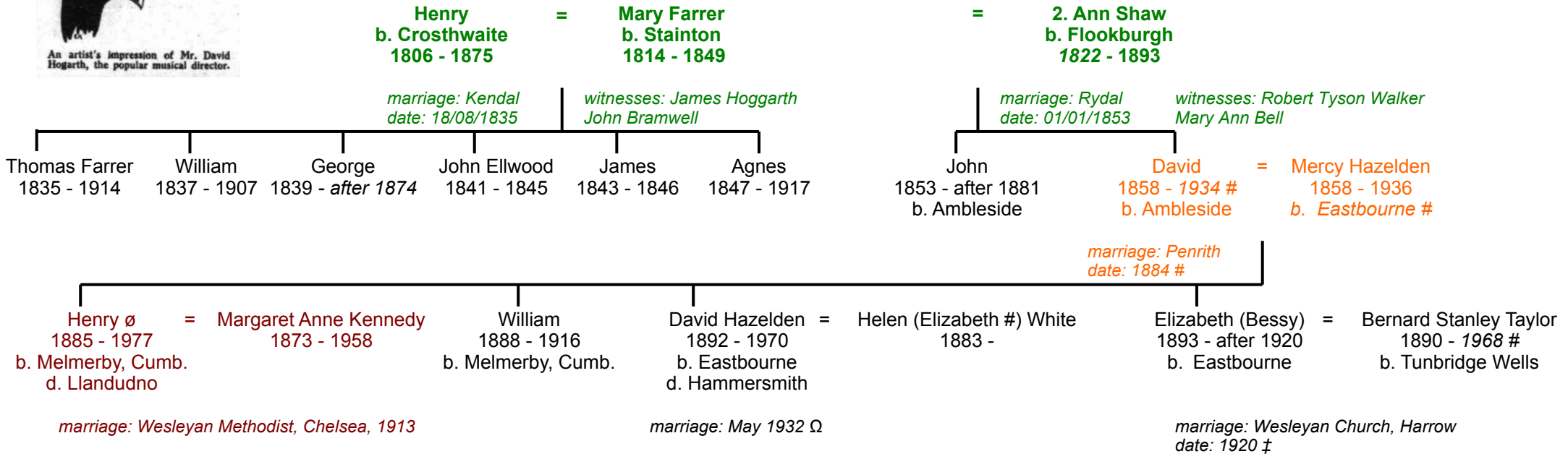


**David Hoggarth born 1858**

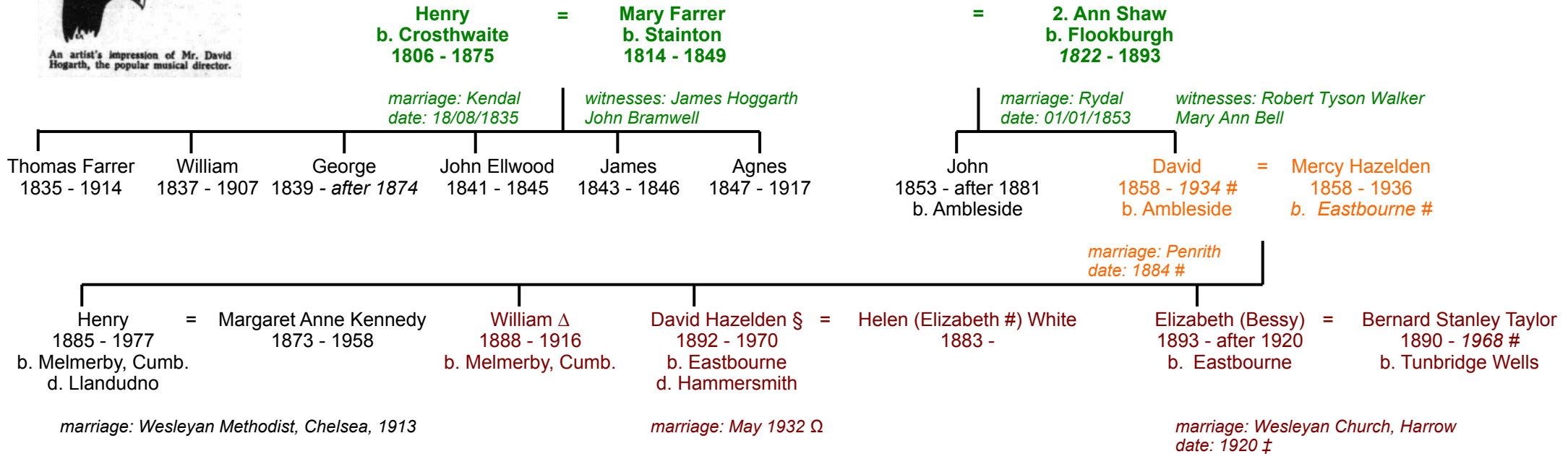

Δ emigrated to Canada in 1912. Worked on the railways. Served with the Canadian Battalion 2nd Canadian Division. Rank of Corporal. On the Vimy Memorial. No known grave.

§ Served in the army from 16th September 1914, joining the Royal West Kent Regiment. He joined the 285th Infantry Battalion Gymnastic Staff in 1917 and rose to the rank of Sergeant. Served in France from April 1918. Demobilised in April 1919. Military records show he was 5' 11", a piano tuner of 9 West Terrace, Eastbourne, also given as his father's address.

After World War I David became a music teacher, church organist, choir conductor, and was a leading figure in music and drama productions in Tunbridge, Sussex, where he lived. He founded the Orpheus Male Voice Choir and after World War II helped revive the Tunbridge Music Festival. He was a Sergeant in the Special Police Force during World War II
